We've all heard it sometime in your youth but some never quite analyzed its origins and make up. This all ended when one of the most authoritative and knowledgeable scholars on the subject matter Professor Mario Nunes from the University of Macau (UM) flew in especially from Macau to make his presentation about the sweet language of

our ancestors at the Macau Cultural Center on March 24th. He also gave a presentation at UC Berkeley the day before. Professor Nunes did his PhD dissertation on the Macanese *Patuá* or Maquista (also spelled Macaista) as a quick start to his blossoming career as a linguist at the UM. Following his hour long slide presentation, there was a skit and sing-a-along in our sweet language "*Doci Papiaçám*" done by no other than local experts Flavia Greubel, Vilma Remedios,

and Cecilia Rosario with Peter Souza on the guitar. Jim Silva also entertained us with his most used and favorite *Patuá* phrases and even our Consul General of Portugal Dra. Maria João Lopes Cardoso recited a



poem in *Patuá* during her speech. It was also an honor to have Ambassador Luis Faro Ramos, President of Instituto Camões present



as our first Portuguese classes started at MCC from their foundation's sponsorship. Dr. Ramos had lived and worked in Macau from 1998 to 1999. The day's program also included a hands-on cooking demonstration "*Apabico*" by our official Lusitano chef Dorothy Oliveira. Most everyone gave it a try

including Dr. Paulo Teves from the Azores Regional Government who did extremely well. At the end of the day, everyone enjoyed the exceptional tasty Macanese dinner provided by members of Casa de Macau, Lusitano, and UMA.

It was a fantastic and fun event well attended and especially noteworthy with the participation of several academics and Portuguese

officials from Portugal and the Azorean government who flew in to attend the 43rd Luso-American Education Conference at U.C. Berkeley and graced us with their presence at the Macau Cultural Center.











RECIPE by Dorothy Oliveira

Apabico



Ingredients: 1 pkg dried Chung Choi (preserved turnip) 1 pkg wheat starch ¹/₂ lb ground pork 1 tbls black pepper A dash of Lea & Perrins sauce Salt to taste

Method:

Soak *Chung Choi* overnight and rinse out. This is very salty. Squeeze out all the water from the *Chung Choi*. In a Cuisinart, chop *Chung Choi* until very fine. Fry until *Chung Choi* is dry in a frying pan without any oil. Add ground pork and cook until done. Add black pepper. Add a dash of Lea & Perrins sauce. Taste to see if you need to add a little salt. Usually it is salty enough. Let cool. Make in three batches. In a bowl add 1 cup of wheat starch. Scald the wheat starch with 1 cup of boiling water. Combine mixture with a ¹/₂ tbls of oil until smooth. Take a little of the dough and roll into a ball; then flatten out as much as you can without the dough breaking apart. Put *Chung Choi* mixture into the middle and fold up into a point (like a little Hershey chocolate kiss). Steam the *apabicos* in a steamer for 20 minutes. Serve with soy and hot sauce. *Makes about 150 pieces*

MARTA PEREIRA DA COSTA

It was indeed a most dynamic and beautiful "Concert of the Century" to see Marta Pereira da Costa, the first and currently only female professional Portuguese Fado guitarist in the world, perform with her band the first time in California as part of the centennial celebrations of Five Wounds Portuguese National Church in San Jose on March 7th. It was two hours of excellent music with three standing ovations including one half way through the concert.

Marta started playing the piano at the age of 4, later at 8 learned the classical guitar and at 18 began to study the Portuguese Guitar

through the hand of Carlos Gonçalves, one of the most important Amália Rodrigues guitar players. While studying to become a civil engineer, she continued to play the Portuguese guitar learning from

master guitarist Mário Pacheco and Fontes Rocha. In 2012, she gave up her civil engineer career to fully dedicate herself to the Portuguese guitar. She was honored in 2014 by the Amália Rodrigues Foundation with the "Musician of the Year Award". Her debut solo album "Marta Pereira da Costa" was released by Warner Music in 2016.

She also happens to be *nossa gente*, cousin of António Pacheco Jorge da Silva.
